Beautiful People,

In the church of my youth, we were taught that women were not allowed to preach. Only men could speak publicly in the congregation, we believed. What we didn't realize (or chose to ignore) was that the very first gospel preacher was, in fact, a woman. Many like to think that Peter preached the first gospel sermon on the day of Pentecost in Acts 2. But this was not the first gospel sermon.

The first gospel sermon was preached at the empty tomb by Mary Magdalene. John tells us the story in his gospel. Mary goes to visit the grave of Jesus, but when she finds an empty tomb, she begins to weep. Then two angels appear and ask her, "Woman, why are you weeping?" She said to them, "They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him."

When she turns around to find Jesus, she doesn't recognize her risen Lord. But when he speaks her name, "Mary", she knows it is her Lord. Jesus sends her to the Disciples to preach the good news of the resurrection, which she has witnessed with her own eyes. John tells us, "Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, 'I have seen the Lord'; and she told them that he had said these things to her."

"I have seen the Lord" -- this is the first Gospel Sermon.

It wasn't a very long sermon (maybe we preachers could learn a thing or two from Mary). But it was a sermon that said everything that needed to be said. "I have seen the Lord!" The message of the gospel and of Easter is Jesus has risen, and He is here, alive in our presence. Easter opens our eyes to see the risen Christ all around us, as fear turns into hope, sorrow into joy, and death into life. Jesus is among us!

Have you seen the Lord?

Tom Webster, the pastor at Wakonda Christian Church, has spent the season of Lent posting on Facebook daily the ways he has seen the Lord. What would happen if you stopped at the end of every day and reflected back on where you have seen the Lord? Was it in your children? A co-worker? A stranger who showed you a momentary kindness? Maybe you saw the Lord in the midst of a challenging circumstance? Maybe you saw the Lord in the least likely person, one whom you were sure could never be the face of God?

Have you seen the Lord? If you have a testimony to share, join with the first Gospel preacher, Mary, in proclaiming this good news. Share with someone (on Facebook or, better, in person!) the good news of Easter--I have seen the Lord!



Beautiful People,

I find this time of Lent to be one of my favorite times of the year. During this time of reflection and self-evaluation, I find myself sitting still longer, listening more, talking less. I find myself watching more and smiling more. I find myself savoring flavors and withholding from things that aren't good practice for myself. I find myself cleaning out the junk in my life; whether it's junk in my soul, junk on my plate, or junk in my home.

It's always hard getting through the first week. A week of refraining from negativity and trying to enjoy goodness. Refraining from harmful things, even thoughts and views. I realize I'm taking care of myself better. I'm taking care of others better. I'm listening to my soul, I'm feeding my soul goodness. I seem to be in better tune with myself and the world around me, which helps me during this time of reflection and evaluation. I am able to see opportunities to serve. I am able to let go when something isn't my area of giftedness. I'm able to get excited and enthusiastic about my areas of giftedness. The spiritual discipline of Lent helps me grow closer to Christ. I'm not perfect, but I am happy. I get to listen more clearly to each of you. I get to see you, hug you, receive a high-five. I get to share the beautiful love of Christ and gift of life with you, beautiful people.

EASTER PRAYER VIGIL

During this Easter season, set aside a half hour of your time for prayer and solitude. On Saturday, March 26th, we will have a 12-hour Prayer Vigil starting at 6:00am and ending at 6:00pm. A Prayer Vigil is continuous prayer by many persons during a certain period of time. This offers to people who share in it the opportunity for a time of uninterrupted dialogue with God.



Nicaragua Mission Trip February 2016 By Mark Durham

I recently had the opportunity to travel to Nicaragua with our former pastor, Pat Nixon. He has been traveling to Nicaragua, twice a year for the past nine years. This mission project is primarily funded by two Disciple's churches in Southeast Kansas. They call themselves, Amigos de Santa Emilia (Friends of Santa Emilia). The focus of this group is health and education. When not in Nicaragua assisting in various activities, the group financially assists with the provision of medical care to this community.

Santa Emilia is a small village a three hour drive northeast of the capital city of Managua. This is coffee country. A coffee plantation is the primary employer in the village. We were in Santa Emilia for five days. The remainder of our time was spent in and near Managua where we worked with folks from La Misión Christiana. La Misión Christiana, which consists of 55 congregations in Nicaragua, is a partner of Global Ministries (a mission joint venture of Disciples of Christ and the United Church of Christ). We also found time to hike, shop, and enjoy the natural beauty of this Central American country.

The extent of our labor was sanding and painting in both locations. These efforts were in support of a preschool in Santa Emilia and at the Primera Iglesia (First Church) in Managua which will accommodate an after-school program run by La Misión Christiana. We also brought seven suitcases of medical and schools supplies from the US. While there we also assisted in negotiating short-term and long-term solutions for continued health care for those in the village.

Beyond the physical labor, this trip was also about seven sojourners performing a "Ministry of Presence". A people-to-people pilgrimage to become immersed in a culture; to learn and experience the qualities that they value, and in the order in which they value them. It was not so much what we were doing, rather we were there to work toward a mutual understanding of our cultures and to convey a sense of compassion and empathy.

Nicaragua was a contradiction to me. So much awesome natural beauty, surrounded by poverty. However, the people of Nicaragua are just beautiful, inside and out, and are devout in their faith.

Pat has developed many friendships there and it was very obvious to us all, the love and appreciation of the people there. Here is a message (with my very rough interpretation) that was sent to Pat after our return: "I am the father of Julissa and Janixia. God bless you from Santa Emilia Nicaragua. For me it was a pleasure to meet you, and I thank God for successfully being able to share this visit with you, and your team from North America who were very kind to the people of Nicaragua. May God continue to bless the community of Santa Emilia with the support of you." At times I felt overwhelmed by what we were experiencing and wondered if we were making a difference. Then I discovered this quote from Desmond Tutu, South African social rights activist and retired Anglican bishop, "Do your little bit of good where you are; it's those little bits of good put together that overwhelm the world."

I am so thankful for the experience and happy to be back home. I am also so proud to be a member of the Norwalk Christian Church, where we live this mission from Bishop Tutu every day. One does not have to make a 5,000 mile journey to "overwhelm the world".




